# SERVICE LEARNING INFORMATION 2024-2025

# REQUIREMENTS SPARK: GRADE 7 AND 8

Students must complete a minimum of one service activity from each column of the SMA BINGO Card. Students should submit a proposal according to their religion teacher's expectations and deadline.

Students should take photos, gather relevant images and/or short video clips of the activities they complete for documentation to include in their digital diary. To receive full points, the images must be of the student completing the service. If they do not have a proper photo, they must have an adult email your Religion teacher to confirm they have completed the service activity.

As students complete the activities, they should keep track of their thoughts and emotions. It is recommended that students keep a journal for reflection.

Students should compose and submit a digital diary according to their religion teacher's expectations. This diary should include answers to the following questions:

- 1. How did completing this service make you feel? Has your perspective about a certain issue or cause changed?
- 2. What knowledge or wisdom have you gained from completing this activity? Have you learned anything new?
- 3. How have you changed or grown personally and/or spiritually?
- 4. How will this experience change how you serve others in the future? Give an example.

The digital diary should be submitted by April 7th, 2025.

### TORCH: GRADE 9 TO 11

Grade 9-11 students must complete 10 hours of in-person service. Service can be to their community, church or marginalized communities. Grade 11 students must complete all 10 hours serving a marginalized community.

Students must decide where they would like to complete their 10 hours of service and contact the organization to arrange a service placement well in advance of the proposal deadline. Students must submit a proposal according to their religion teacher's expectations and deadline. Students must have their site supervisor complete the attached form. If students volunteer at more than one site, they must submit one form for each site.

As students complete the activities, they should keep track of their thoughts and emotions. It is recommended that students keep a journal for reflection. After every visit, students should reflect on how they felt when they were engaged in completing the service.

Students should compose and submit a digital diary according to their religion teacher's expectations. This diary should include answers to the following questions:

- 1. How did completing this service make you feel? Has your perspective about a certain issue or cause changed?
- 2. What knowledge or wisdom have you gained from completing this activity? Have you learned anything new?
- 3. How have you changed or grown personally and/or spiritually?
- 4. How will this experience change how you serve others in the future? Give an example.

Students must also include a piece of scripture or spiritual/religious teaching that connects to their overall experience. The digital diary should be submitted by April 7th, 2025.
