

General Information

Update from Administration – Mrs. Connie Yunyk will be responsible for all activities and academic programs for students in Grades 11 and 12. Mrs. Carol-Ann Swayzie will be responsible for all activities and academic programs for students in Grades 9 and 10. Mrs. Michelle Klus will be responsible for all activities and academic programs in Grades 7 and 8.

School Calendar – a calendar of major events is available on the SMA website. The calendar outlines important dates including two major assessment periods in December/January and June. All students are expected to be present during the assessment periods. A doctor's certificate is required to verify illness or absence during the assessment periods. Parents are asked NOT to book holidays or time away from school during these periods. If a student misses a mid-year assessment it will affect the value of their final mark.

Student Timetables, Student Agendas, lockers and locks – will be distributed during the homeroom period (8:30 a.m.) on Thursday, September 6, 2012. The agenda includes the school calendar, general school and student information, policies and procedures. Please take time to familiarize yourself with this information.

Homeroom lists will be posted at school entrances and on classroom doors. Students are to proceed directly to their homeroom at 8:30 a.m. for opening exercises, timetable and agenda distribution and locker assignment. Full winter or summer uniform is required. Bring school supplies.

Textbooks – On the first day of classes, subject area teachers issue numbered textbooks to each student. Each assigned textbook is the responsibility of the student to whom it is assigned. In June 2013, students will be responsible for returning assigned textbooks in accordance with the following procedures:

Non-exam courses - to the subject teacher at the last class.

Exam courses - prior to the final exam in a designated classroom.

Students who do not return textbooks as indicated or who have damaged or lost textbooks must pay the replacement cost and a \$25.00 fine by June 26, 2013.

On August 31st, 1902, in St. Mary's Parish (now the Cathedral), Archbishop Langevin blessed the corner stone for the Wellington Crescent Academy. Construction took the better part of a year to complete at a cost of \$75,000. The Sisters moved from the Notre Dame Academy into their new home on August 14, 1903.
