The last time our newsletter hit your inbox, I wished you a Merry Christmas; now, we are well into 2019. This month's newsletter focuses on the "happenings" around the Academy, and here are a few highlights.

We welcome Mrs. Jodi Funk Clements, SMA's first Manager of Human Resources and Mr. Vincent Ocampo, SMA's first Junior Graphic Designer. Our staff is growing and we are grateful for these two very talented individuals.

We were very encouraged by the number of prospective families who came to our Open House in January - we had a full house! The admissions process is in full swing, with entrance tests and interviews to be completed by late February. This year, re-registration of current

students was advanced to January. I am happy to report that our retention of students is very high. Completing these two processes allows for an earlier start to planning, programming and hiring for the upcoming school year. Through our bursary fund, SMA strives to remain accessible to all qualifying families who wish to have their daughters experience an SMA education. In the current year, 86 students have been awarded bursaries totalling \$365,000, representing approximately 15% of our student body. The **deadline** for bursary applications for the upcoming **2019-2020 school year is May 1, 2019**. The application form can be found at <https://www.smamb.ca/admissions/bursary/>.

Our fourth annual **An Evening at the Academy** was a solid success once again this year, attended by 300 enthusiastic and generous guests. The event netted almost \$250,000 which included a significant donation to the Bursary Fund from our Manitoba Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary (SNJM). We thank you all! We continue to collaborate with Stantec

and are very close to finalizing the Traffic Flow re-design and revision of estimated costs. We are hopeful that this information will be shared with our community well before spring break. While vehicular traffic flow through the grounds with safe and controlled drop-off points is central to the design, pedestrian safety and beautiful green spaces have not been compromised. Thank you for your patience and please continue to drive carefully and respectfully as you make your way through our driveway.

Finally, I am deeply touched by the many parents, students, faculty, staff, alumnae, board and community members who have signed up to volunteer on many of SMA's 150th Birthday event planning committees. This is encouraging and validates the work we are doing to honour and celebrate the Manitoba SNJM and St. Mary's Academy during this pivotal point in our history. St. Mary's Academy Celebrates 150 Years

St. Mary's Academy was established on May 1, 1869 by the Sisters of Charity of Montreal (more commonly known as the Grey Nuns) in the Red River Settlement in the vicinity of the junction of the Red and Assiniboine Rivers. By 1874, the Grey Nuns informed Archbishop Taché that they wished to return to their mission of health care and work among the poor. The Archbishop, in need of new teachers, reached out to the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary (SNJM), a relatively new teaching congregation from Québec.

On August 22, 1874, Sisters Jean de Dieu, Superior, Marie Florentine, Electa-du-Sacré-Coeur and Marie Elie, all between the ages of 21 and 27, arrived in Winnipeg to assume responsibility of St. Mary's Academy. On September 1, 1874 the SNJM registered their first students

— twelve girls and seven boys, increasing to 126 students within weeks. From a rented two-room schoolhouse in 1869 to a 140,000 square foot building situated on 11 acres in 2019, St. Mary's Academy has navigated many changes. However, one thing has remained the same—its Mission to educate in a faith-based environment. To date, 62,736 students have graduated from St. Mary's Academy—a spirit, mind and body education has endured since the beginning.

To celebrate 150 years the Academy has several events and activities planned. The celebrations are for everyone who is and has been connected to the Academy—SNJM, Grey Nuns, alumnae, students, parents, faculty, staff, board members and friends. Commemorating 150 years is not only about celebrating friendships, reuniting with old friends, reminiscing with

colleagues or becoming better acquainted with new friends; it is also about observing and honouring the legacy of learning, faith, service and leadership. The listing below outlines celebrations which will take place from **May 1 to December 8, 2019**.

The Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary (SNJM) Network of Schools was founded in the 1980s for support and networking among the administrations of our North American SNJM schools. Since then, as with many things, it has evolved to provide additional opportunities among our schools. For example, when our SNJM school in Portland (also named St. Mary's Academy) was celebrating its 150th in 2009, they invited all of the choirs from the Network of Schools to come to Portland for a massive concert. Then, the SNJM Congregational Justice and Peace committee launched the Youth Justice Forums. SMA Winnipeg was the first to pilot it in the summer of 2009. Teams from our Network of Schools (and beyond) gathered to learn about our SNJM commitments to justice through our corporate stands, ministries, and deepen

their understanding of our charism and mission. These Youth Justice Forums have continued every three years.

This October, as one of the events planned during our 150th Birthday at SMA, we have invited our 6 Sister SNJM Schools to "Come and See" Winnipeg during *Mother Marie-Rose Week (October 5th – 11th)*. Each school will be sending 3 students accompanied by a staff member. While they are here they will experience life at SMA by attending classes, explore our city and learning about our multicultural home. They will also spend time with our SNJM prayer pals, Alumnae and Board members. We will be asking for families to consider being a billet/host family to a student. More about this and formal volunteer opportunities will be arriving in your email in early May – stay tuned.

As we prepare our hearts and minds toward the season of Lent, we will focus on those who walk with us on the Journey. These stories and people, like those of Advent, point to the greater story of our faith; the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is within this great story of our faith that we find our SMA 150 story.

It is hard to believe we are half way through February already! Each week, as we get closer to *Celebrating our Legacy*, we're learning more and more about the amazing women who guided us through the last 149 years at SMA. As we continue to learn about our roots and our history each week during morning prayer, we are also looking for ways we can challenge ourselves to continue this legacy.

This month, four students took up this challenge and made it their mission to educate the student body about one of the three SNJM corporate stands: Human Trafficking. These four students had the privilege of attending the SNJM Youth Justice Forum last July in Oakland California, and since then they have been working towards creating the *SMA Human Trafficking Awareness Week*, which took place in the week of February 4th. They began the week by presenting a session to each classroom on what Human Trafficking is. The students were informed about both

forced labour and sexual exploitation of women and children. Following these sessions, students were then invited to make a statement and challenged to do one thing to take a stand against human trafficking.

We concluded our awareness week on the **International Day of Prayer Against Human Trafficking** with our special guest speaker, former MP **Joy Smith, of the Joy Smith Foundation**. Smith is a leading advocate against human trafficking worldwide and is a champion of women's rights. She shared her experiences in the fight against human trafficking right here in Winnipeg and all across Canada. Her strong belief is that education is our greatest weapon in the fight against human trafficking.
