

Response to the needs of these charities has been good. Over five hundred individual hampers were donated by students and staff for the clients of the *Immaculate Conception Drop-in Centre* at Christmas. In addition, the members of the Leadership Council made cookies to supplement the lunch on hamper distribution day. Many classes have held in-class fund raising events to raise at least \$1.00 per student per month. Three color days have raised about \$3,300.00 to be distributed.

In October speakers from our favorite charities came in on a Saturday to educate the members of the Mission Club about their organizations. This was very enlightening and helped us realize that the need

for help is great in the City of Winnipeg as well as throughout the developing world.

This month the members of the Mission Club are collecting signatures on a petition to send to Mr. Vic Toews expressing concern over the government's decision to cancel salaries to part-time chaplains such as the one that supports the clients of the *Next Step Program*.

In May, together with other groups in the school, we are helping to organize a special day for all St. Mary's students dealing with issues of justice. So far, it has been a busy and rewarding year.
