Greetings and Happy Autumn! It is a wonderful time to look outside and marvel at God's creation and remember how blessed we are, and at the same time conscious of a world that is in so much need of hope.

At our Mother Marie-Rose Mass on October 6th, Fr. Mike Koryluk spoke of Mother Marie-Rose as a woman who saw the world with eyes of hope. She was a remarkable woman who has left a legacy to be proud of. During Mother Marie-Rose week, I had the pleasure of visiting all of the Grades 7, 8 and 9 classes and sharing with them a bit of her story and the beginnings the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and

Mary. In order to understand *Charism and Mission*, we need to know the story – the person and people who have shared their gifts in a particular way with the church and the world. To that end, this year in the newsletters I will share with you information about Mother Marie-Rose Durocher so that all of us can continue to deepen our knowledge and broaden our perspective.

Early Life of the Foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary

Mother Marie-Rose, born Eulalie Durocher, on October 6th 1811, in St. Antoine-sur-la Richelieu, Quebec to Genevieve and Olivier Durocher. She was their tenth child. The

Durocher family was generous, faith filled and economically blessed. They were very proud of their French heritage and they were a well-respected family in the community. There was another child born after Eulalie, who unfortunately died shortly after birth and so she was considered the baby of the family.

November: Villa Rosa


December: we will continue a long held tradition of preparing Christmas Gift Bags for the people that come to the Immaculate Conception Drop-In Centre.

PSAT at SMA

On October 19th, Grade 11 students who registered at the end of May in Grade 10 will have an opportunity to write the PSAT. The PSAT is a standardized test administered by the College Board in the United States and SMA has been granted the ability to offer this test to our students. The benefits of taking the PSAT is to get in practice before a student writes the SAT in May/Jun of her Grade 11 year or Oct/Nov of her Grade 12 year. Students currently in Grade 10, who have plans to apply to a University in the USA, will have an opportunity in May 2017 to register for the PSAT with Ms. Uruski.
